The Centre for the Study of Japanese Religions (CSJR) at the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London, functions as a centre for scholars and students of Japanese religion in Europe, promoting the academy study of Japanese religion in all its diversity and through the deployment of multiple methodologies. The Centre has a rich programme of research-related activities that take place throughout the entire academic year, including the weekly CSJR seminar series, a monthly Japanese Religions Forum for postgraduate students, and annual international conferences and workshops. It also hosts events such as films, concerts and exhibitions related to Japanese religions, which are open to members of the general public with an interest in the religious experience of Japan.

The Centre sponsors the MA in Japanese Religions at SOAS, and supports research studentships and post-doctoral fellowships. It is currently offering bursaries at MA and PhD levels.
